## **Election Day Recap**

The red wave that was anticipated by many never materialized on after the election as the Minnesota DFL defied the usual midterm backlash

against the party of the sitting president.

There is a lot to analyze in the election results, but what we do know is that Governor Tim Walz has been reelected to a second term after defeating former state Senator Dr. Scott Jensen; the DFL will remain in control of the state House and what was the biggest surprise of the night, the DFL has flipped the state Senate.

Republicans had hoped to flip seats held by the DFL in the suburbs by focusing on crime and inflation but that plan did not work. In fact, the DFL was able to flip seats in Blaine, Coon Rapids, Lino Lakes, and Shakopee by mostly focusing on protecting abortion rights, and funding for education. The GOP continues to win more and more seats in Greater Minnesota, but the DFL was able to hold onto enough of those seats to gain majorities.

The DFL flipping the Senate gives them their first "trifecta" of power since 2013. The majorities in both chambers are slim, especially in the Senate where it looks to be a one seat majority for the DFL (34-33). Even though the majorities will be slim, all the committee gavels will be in the hands of the DFL. The party that has the gavels, controls the agenda.

In the next few days the four caucuses will gather to pick leadership. On the House side, the DFL is expected to reelect Melissa Hortman as Speaker of the House, but is in need of a new majority leader after Rep. Ryan Winkler chose to run for Hennepin County Attorney. On the GOP side we need to watch if Rep. Kurt Daudt will try to remain as minority leader or if he will take a step back after leading the House GOP for ten years. There will also be some reshuffling of committee chairs due to retirements.

In the Senate, the DFL is in an interesting position and in need of a majority leader since their current leader, Sen. Melisa Franzen won't be returning to the Senate after being drawn into the same district with Sen. Ron Latz. The new DFL majority leader once chosen will

have to assign committee chairs. The GOP has been in the majority in the Senate since January 2017 and is currently lead by Sen. Jeremy Miller. It would be a surprise if Sen. Miller isn't back as minority leader.

As we look ahead the Legislature will be back in session January 3. The budget surplus from last year remains and now the DFL has total control. A budget will need to be passed for the next two years, and talk of a bonding bill continues to grow.

MPR News this morning reported Governor Walz and Speaker Hortman have said they remain open to a special session focused around public safety before January 3.
